## **APA Style Basics**

To find out how to format or cite anything not covered in this handout, consult *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association*, 6<sup>th</sup> ed. (Call number BF76.7 .P83 2010) or the Online Writing Lab at Purdue University (<u>https://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/resource/560/01/</u>)

## Format

Papers should have margins of 1" on all sides and all text should be double spaced, using legible font. APA recommends Times New Roman in 12 pt. Each page should have a header with the TITLE OF YOUR PAPER (all caps) starting in the left margin and page number in the upper right hand corner. If your title is longer than 50 characters, use a shortened version.

There has to be a title page with a special header that states: Running Head: TITLE OF YOUR PAPER and page number. Centered on the page you put The Title of Your Paper, Your name (new line, first and last name), the school/institute where you did the research (new line, e.g. Palo Alto College).

The title page is followed by a page with an Abstract. On the first line of the page, centered, put Abstract. Then write a single paragraph with a summary of your research (topic, research questions, methods, results, data analysis, and conclusions). It should be 150-250 words.

After the text of the paper, on a separate page, is the **References** list. Put "References" as a title on the page (no quotation marks), centered. List all sources cited in the paper, alphabetized by authors' last names, double spaced and using hanging indents. If an author has more than one entry on your list, entries are listed in chronological order. Items without an author are listed by title.

## **In-Text (Parenthetical) Citations**

The author's last name, the year of publication, and the page number(s) from which the quote is taken must appear in the text, and a complete reference should appear in the References list. If more than one author has the same last name, provide the author's initials (or even her/his full name if authors share initials) in your citation. If you cite more than one work by an author from the same year, add a letter (a, b, c) to each case in the References list and use the same letter in the citation. Examples of in-text citations:

According to Jones (1998) "Students often had difficulty using APA style, especially when it was their first time" (p. 199). Jones (1998) found "students often had difficulty using APA style" (p. 199); what implications does this have for teachers?

Short quotations (fewer than four typed lines of prose or three lines of verse) can be incorporated in your text, enclosed within double quotation marks. Place quotations longer than 40 words in a free-standing block, and omit quotation marks. Start the quotation on a new line, indented one inch from the left margin.
